Tamara: Okay. And of course, before we begin, just want to remind you that as always

with book chats, we talk full spoilers here. So, spoiler alert. You have been warned.

Today we are discussing that time I got drunk and saved a demon. Written by Kimberly

Lemming, published by Orbit. The audiobook is narrated by Hazel Addison. The Kindle

version is 278 pages, and the audiobook is 7 hours and 25 minutes. Casey, would you

please read the synopsis?

Casey: Spice Trader Cinnamon's quiet life is turned upside down when she ends up on

a quest with the fiery demon in this irreverently quirky romcom fantasy that is sweet,

steamy, and funny as hell. Perfect for fans of legends and lates and the dragon's bride.

All she wanted to do was live her life in peace, maybe get a cat, expand the family's

spice farm. Really anything that didn't involve going on an adventure where an orc

might rip her face off. But they say the goddess has a favorite, and if so, sin is clearly

not one of them. After saving the demon Fallon in a wine drunk stupor, all Fallon wants

to do is kill an evil witch, enslaving his people. And who can blame him? But he's

dragging cinnamon along for the ride. On the bright side, at least he keeps burning off

his shirt.

Tamara: Yes, that is the bright side. I guess I didn't even read the synopsis. That's why

I'm laughing. I'm like, what?

Tamara: Okay. Yeah, I get it. Okay.

Tamara: As we do high level. When you finished this book, what did you think?

Casey: I thought it was adorable, and I want to read the next one.

Tamara: Okay.

Tamara: Yeah, I kind of agree.

Tamara: I'm like, that's cute.

Casey: It's quirky and fun and similar, but different at the same time.

Tamara: Yeah. And I actually thought it was just enough spice for me. It wasn't too

outrageous. it was balanced for me.

Tamara: Yes.

Tamara: so, yeah, I think I will read the next one. But obviously I waited because there's

no way I wanted to use anything.

Casey: Yes.

Tamara: And I think the next one has to do with characters we've already been

introduced to.

Casey: I think Felix the werewolf. Is the werewolf in the next one? Because that title

says it's,

Tamara: Hold on.

Casey: The next title is that time I got drunk and yeeted a love potion at a werewolf. So

I'm pretty sure that's Felix.

Tamara: Yeah. I mean, Felix is like, they all just want cinnamon. They're like, wait, you

rescued us. Let's be best friends. I couldn't like the scene. she's, like, still in the bed,

and Felix is like, hello. Morning.

Tamara: Good morning.

Tamara: You're naked.

Casey: But let's go.

Tamara: We've got stuff to do. Come on.

Tamara: She like, what is funny? He funny. Yeah.

Tamara: Okay.

Tamara: Yay. So this is one step better than we were this time last month. Yes. Even

though I finished this book a week ago, again, I don't feel like I found a bunch of things.

Casey: You didn't hate it? It's saturated.

Tamara: No, I didn't. I still like it. I still like it. This is a win.

Tamara: Yeah.

Tamara: So book talk actually presented something fun that liked.

Tamara: Yes.

The diversity in all of these characters was wonderful. I loved it so

much

Tamara: And, Casey, before we jump in even more, did you tell us already why.

Tamara: You picked this book?

Casey: I think I did in the after show in January, but I don't remember. I know it was

short. It was Valentine's day. We want diversity in our book talk. I saw it on book talk

once, and I was like, hey, let's go for it.

Tamara: Yeah.

Tamara: I watched a couple of TikTok videos, and I love the way these characters look.

Like, honestly, cinnamon has brown skin with pink hair, which she complains about.

Tamara: She complains about this pink hair.

Tamara: So she's super cute. And her dress that has infinite pockets.

Casey: That carries just, like, bottles of mead and a dozen apples at a time.

Tamara: All kinds of spices, all kind of things in there. and of course, what's his face?

What's his name again?

Casey: Fallon the dragon.

Tamara: Fallon. He definitely looks. Know how you would think a dragon looks? And I

did not tell, like, okay. So when I looked at the photo, I thought that was his hair braided

at the top. I didn't think it was horns.

Casey: Horns.

Tamara: Until the book.

Tamara: He's like, grab my horns.

Tamara: I'm like, what the. Oh, those are horns.

Casey: They're horns.

Tamara: Yeah. So he's got, like, this long, luscious black hair. He's got, like, a body on

him. He could be singing that body out. and he's got a little asian flair to him.

Tamara: Oh, yeah.

Tamara: Which I also enjoy.

Casey: The diversity in all of these characters was wonderful. I loved it so much. It was

so refreshing. Everybody was different skin tone, but it didn't mean anything. Like, yes,

cinnamon and her family are.

Casey: Spice traders, and I love that ongoing joke of, like, here's how you spice your

food.

Tamara: Spice. Your food has spice names like cinnamon and cardamom or whatever.

Casey: One of the brothers was Chili, and the other, I think, was cumin.

Tamara: Yes, cumin. That's it.

Casey: Her sister was named Cherry.

Tamara: I was like, Cherry's a spice. That's a fruit that doesn't really fit. Wasn't she the

youngest of them?

Casey: She was the youngest, yeah.

Tamara: Maybe they got tired of the spices. They needed another c name, and that's

what they got. Cherry, I guess.

Tamara: Yeah.

Tamara: I don't know. It was cute, though. I'm like, okay, I'm digging the characters, the

new characters, because this felt like the theme was, we have to take down this witch

that's holding people as slaves, basically, and the demons aren't as bad as you think,

and your savior goddess is the bad one. So it's very true to that theme, but it was also

kind of, it had these wizard of Oz vibes. And what I mean by that is.

Tamara: We'Re off to see and we're going.

Tamara: To, like, as we go, we're going to meet people and add to our team, and we're

going to just keep defeating. We'll have each little thing to do as we go along.

Tamara: Yeah.

Tamara: So it kind of had that vibe to it, which I did not mind. I thought it was kind of

cute. Oh, yeah, it was really cute.

Casey: It was very questy.

I think the simplicity of this story is what made it enjoyable

Yeah. They were going on a quest and each time they gained more friends and more

people to follow them. I agree.

Tamara: Yeah.

Tamara: And also, I think actually it's like the simplicity of it is also what made it

enjoyable. The story wasn't complicated, the goal was clear, the themes were clear. But

I think what made it special were the characters and how they interacted with each

other.

Tamara: Even valid. Oh my God, he gets so enraged at anybody who looks at

Cinnamon, sideways. I will kill them all. She's like, calm down, calm down.

Tamara: You don't have to do that.

Tamara: He's like, I'll take everybody. I'm like, whoa, okay, m alpha man. But you know,

he makes the friends. They all make the friends. But he also, when she tells her.

Casey: No, he stops killing people.

Tamara: Yeah. Like the quintessential, I guess, thug rapists that come along the road.

And she just got finished telling him not to kill people, but he kills one of them or both of

them. No, one of them.

Casey: One accidentally and throws the other into the river.

| Tamara: And she's like, I'm sorry I killed someone. And she's like, that's okay.                                     |

| There were trigger warnings on this book. Which was important  |

because it does seem light hearted

Tamara: Oh my gosh. Should we try to break this down a little bit?

Casey: I mean, honestly, I did enjoy it as it was, but part of me wishes there was

another 100 pages just giving more to the story, more detail about the world, more

development of the world and the characters. because it is a little insta love, even

though they're together for a few weeks before know, finally hops on his dick as she.

Casey: I wish there was. But like, as a short story, it works.

Tamara: Yeah, I think it works. And I think if we had gotten a little bit more, it would have

been nice. And also there were trigger warnings.

Tamara: For this.

Tamara: Which was important because even though it does seem light hearted on the

surface, there were a couple of things and I kind of knew that the consent thing was in

there.

Casey: Yes.

Tamara: There was one scene when they get together and it seems like it's a little gray

at first, but then she gets on board pretty quickly and you can see, okay, well, she's into

this, but very at the beginning, she's kind of like saying, man. And he's like, you know

you want this. Why do you think you don't want this? Stop acting like you don't. I'm like,

oh, no, it's only hot.

Casey: When fictional men do that. When men in real life do that, I just know it doesn't

work. Fictional men? Yes. When they're dragons, yes, it works. If you're not a dragon,

don't do it.

Tamara: Yeah, definitely. So I was like, I did take note, but again, it warned me, okay, it's

there. So I kind of was like, okay, I appreciate that.

Tamara: Hm.

Tamara: So when I came across it, I wasn't like, oh, my God.

Casey: And that's what trigger warnings are for. Honestly, I almost think that the content

wasn't as triggering as I thought it was going to be. When I read that trigger warning, I

was like, oh, no, Dubcon can be pretty bad in some books when they put that trigger

warning on there. And then as I was reading this, I was like, she's not saying yes

instantly, but she's not saying no. And she's been attracted to him this whole time. So I

appreciate the warning, but I've seen it much worse in other books. And I was like,

gearing up for that. And so when I got to this, I was like, oh, this is fine. This is good.

Dubious consent is when someone asks a woman if she wants

something

Tamara: So for our listeners that may not know what Dubcon is, can you tell us what it

is?

Casey: Dubious consent.

Tamara: Yes.

Casey: So that's when somebody, in this instance, our dragon hero is teasing our

heroine and he's like, you want me? And she's like, I'm not sure I do.

Tamara: I don't think so.

Casey: And he's like, I'm going to tie you up to this bed and start kissing on you and

make you say yes.

Tamara: Yeah.

Casey: And we're in her point of view. We see from her head that she is turned on. She

is internally debating, and she ultimately decides, yes, I do want this, and says yes.

Tamara: Yeah.

Tamara: So I think the sentence actually says, you've convinced yourself you have to

say no to this.

Casey: Yes. Which is kind of true because he's a demon. And for the first half of the

book, she's like, oh, my God, how can I be this attracted to a demon? Demons are

supposed to be these evil, brainless, God awful things. That kill anything in their past.

Tamara: Yeah.

Tamara: And now she's, like, eyeballing him, shirt.

Casey: Is burning off, and he's really pretty, and we're both naked in the river together.

Tamara: Really pretty.

Tamara: Yeah, she's definitely down. But I think that's why. I think it gets a pass,

because we were in her head. We were in her head and we could see that it wasn't

really. I don't want to do this.

Casey: Yeah, it was never a. No, it was, maybe not, but I am interested.

Tamara: she was definitely, I think, kind of exploring. And the thing about her is you all

know how much I hate a virgin. And she wasn't. She had a boyfriend, but I think that

she really didn't know what she liked because it seemed like the more he was kind of

being dominant in the bedroom, the more she would respond to it. And it seemed like it

was kind of foreign to her a little bit.

Casey: So she's, like, 1920. She, talked about having the one boyfriend, and then after

they broke up, she never really hooked up with anybody since. And then, yeah. As our

fallon guy is, like, being more dominant and aggressive, she's like, ooh, I've never tried

this before and I like it.

Tamara: I watch this.

Casey: This is really turning me on.

Tamara: Yeah. He does almost cross the line, though. So at the end of the book, but she

works him. Have you heard that phrase where, like, if the man is the head, quote

unquote, the woman is the neck?

Casey: Yes, I learned that in my big fat greek wedding.

Tamara: Yeah. So that's where I must have heard it from. But it's true. That's how

cinnamon played. Did him. She played him? No, she treated him at the end, after she is,

hurt, and he brings her to the island and knocks her out. She's unconscious for days.

And he's like, using magic to make them. This, the most spectacular house.

Tamara: She wakes up.

Tamara: Is she like, hold on, what is happening? What happened? And he is, like, really

beating around the bush. And she's like, wait a minute. You don't want me to leave this

island, do you? He actually admits it, and she's like, okay, well, you know, can't we just

use some magic and do something else? And he's like, oh, I didn't think of that. I just

thought I had to keep you isolated away from.

Casey: He's a man, and men are like, oh, my God, I have to protect you. Keep you

hidden away in the tower, not like, oh, yeah, I can give you, like, a protective shield.

Tamara: I mean, you can make all of this stuff. Can't you just make me something?

Casey: Make me a shield, dude. Make me a shield.

Tamara: He's like, oh, I guess I could, but see, that's cinnamon thinking because most

of them have been like, you're.

Tamara: Not going to kick me on this island.

Tamara: But instead she's like, let me just work with him. Yes.

Casey: She's like, hold on, honey, we need to have a conversation here. I'm not going to stay in a very pretty cage. I don't care how pretty it is. I don't care how pretty you are. I'm not staying in a cage. And I love that about her.

Tamara: She's like, let's work something out because it's not it. And he's like, okay. I think he knew he was never going to get his way. Oh, definitely.

Casey: That's why he kept her asleep for like four days.

Tamara: Yeah. I'm like, who does that? She's just sleeping. Yeah. Oh my God. No, that was very rude.

Casey: That was rude. That was, probably the worst thing he did in the book. For me, at least.

Casey: I don't care when he killed people.

## This was a fast read overall because it was just over 200 pages

I don't care when he ate people, keeping her asleep for four days. No, sir, I do not like.

Tamara: Yeah, do not like. yeah, I think that was the worst. But he seemed to be better after that. And of course skipping to the end, she had no problem spending several months there with him so he could figure out the spell and they could have a good time

together.

Casey: I wouldn't mind spending a few months on a honeymoon island, having lots of

hot sex, like. Yeah, sounds great. As long as I know I can leave eventually. Yeah, if

you're telling me that's forever. No, I don't want to stay here forever.

Tamara: But two, three months?

Tamara: She had to go back to her family like they were wondering what happened to

her. You can't just never come back.

Casey: She loves her family so much. Her family is everything to her.

Tamara: And I think he knows that. Yeah, he comes back with her and family just kind of

he's like, oh, and yeah, we killed them and we defeated them and yeah, we got married.

Tamara: What? You're married? What happened now?

Tamara: Yeah, no big deal. We got married.

Casey: I will say I love how at the very beginning, of the story, the night she meets him,

she saves him, he chases her a bit, she ends up at home and then he leaves, but she

doesn't realize he's gone. So she like barricades the door, tells her parents there's a

demon out there chasing her and everybody just kind of brushed her off as crazy. Her

brothers show up the next day, they're like, yeah, we heard you had a crazy dream, you

crazy little girl. And they're teasing her until he shows up in the fucking window. He's

like, hello, it's me.

Tamara: I'm demon.

Tamara: I'm here.

Tamara: Hi, I'm back. And it was just such a casual.

Casey: Like, hello, I'm here. And her whole family's like, oh, what?

Tamara: And then she leaves with him.

Tamara: Okay. And so there it is with the comedy. Right? I think that part, that stuff is

the comedy.

Tamara: Oh, yeah.

Tamara: And I am not the biggest fan of comedy, but it worked here. And again, I didn't

mind it, but I think the author did a good job of balancing the comedy because it wasn't

like nonstop, which was good. We had some important stuff in there. Like when

Cinnamon thinks she sees her sister in the water in the swamp.

Tamara: Or whatever, and she goes out there.

Casey: And, oh my God, that was really dark and emotional.

Tamara: And.

Tamara: Yeah, Fallon's like, that's not your sister. Come this way. Come on.

Casey: Come on, we got to save you. And she's like, but my sister. But sherry. Tamara: Yeah. Tamara: You're like, look again. Casey: The dog. Tamara: Yeah, that was crazy. So yeah, there was funny stuff, there was more serious stuff, there was sexy stuff. And it was pretty balanced, which made it be a fast read for me. Casey: Oh, yeah, no, it was a fast read overall because it was just over 200 pages. Tamara: A little more than that. Casey: I don't remember what you said, but it was fast, it was funny, it was sexy. It had pretty much everything. Tamara: Yeah. Tamara: And actually this wasn't, I think I said 279 on Kindle. Yes, 279.

Tamara: It did feel short, but it definitely was that long because I know I did pick up the Kindle version.

Casey: It felt shorter than that to me.

more. It's so much more gripping. And, yes, he's kind of got the fabio thing a little bit.

Casey: He's got her chin. He's holding her chin.

Tamara: Yeah.

Casey: No, the new one is sexy.

Tamara: Yeah, definitely. And I feel like that gives you a better idea of what you're in for.

The other one, honestly, if I saw this first cover, I'd have been like, I don't know if I want

to read this?

Tamara: Yeah.

Tamara: Honestly, that's why I put it off.

Casey: That's exactly why I put it off. I was hearing good things about it, but with that

cover I was like, yeah, no, but I'm really glad it got the COVID update. And I'm really

glad we read this because yeah, this is a great book. Probably my favorite book in 2024

so far. I know we're only one month in, well, m one month and a few days, but I think it's

my favorite book of 2024 so far.

the book. So it kind of is like, yeah, these things happen, but we move forward, we

move on.
